SCHOOL TARGETS

GOAL 1 (Advanced Placement): Increase exams taken from 65% to 70% of all students enrolled in AP Courses by the end of 2016/2017.

GOAL 2 (SAT): By the end of the June administration of the SAT the average score of the Class of 2018 will be at least 1100 (Class of 2017 was 1079 in June 2016).

SCHOOL STRATEGIES

GOAL 1 (Advanced Placement):

1. *In order to impact AP performance for all students, staff will participate in AP Team meetings to collaborate around ensuring alignment of instruction with AP curriculum and developing best practices for AP instruction.*
2. *To establish rigor in all courses, staff will participate in professional learning aligned with UBD as well as continue development and implementation of common assessments.*
3. *In order to impact AP performance for all students, staff will monitor student performance quarterly (A.B.C. and D grades), continue vertical articulation, targeted interventions, and efforts to increase student preparedness for AP classes to ensure that all students will participate in at least one AP Course by graduation.*

GOAL 2: (SAT):

1. *In order to impact SAT performance for all students, staff will participate in department based professional learning designed to assist them in aligning instruction and common assessments with the redesigned SAT/PSAT.*
2. *In order to impact SAT performance for all students, staff will facilitate the registration of all students who met the PSAT benchmark by the June administration.*
3. *In order to impact SAT performance for all students, staff will assist students to enroll in Khan Academy SAT Prep and will encourage use during school year.*
